<p>Nursing and care of children and adolescents with physical or mental illnesses; care and feeding of new-born babies and infants; nursing and care of disabled, seriously ill or dying children and adolescents; nursing contributions to health promotion and disease prevention in children and adolescents; nursing contributions to the rehabilitation of children and adolescents</p> <p><b>a) Autonomous activities</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Assessing the care needs of the patients or clients and the degree of their dependence on care as well as identification and evaluation of the resources available for meeting these needs (nursing anamnesis)</li> <li>- identifying care needs (nursing diagnosis)</li> <li>- planning of care, defining nursing objectives and deciding on nursing measures to be taken (planning of nursing care) - performing nursing measures</li> <li>- analysing the results of nursing measures (evaluation of nursing care)</li> <li>- providing information on disease prevention and taking measures of health promotion; psycho-social care</li> <li>- documenting the nursing process; organising nursing care</li> <li>- instructing and supervising auxiliary personnel; instructing and supporting students during their training</li> <li>- co-operating in nursing research - performing life-saving emergency procedures if and as long as there is no doctor available</li> </ul> <p><b>b) Activities with shared responsibility</b></p> <p>Performing diagnostic and therapeutic measures on a doctor's orders, such as administering medicines, preparing and administering injections, taking blood from veins or capillaries, etc.</p> <p><b>c) Interdisciplinary activities</b></p> <p>Co-operating in measures to prevent diseases and accidents as well as to maintain and promote health; preparing patients or persons needing care and their family members for discharge from the hospital or nursing care institution and providing assistance in the continuation of care; health counselling; counselling and arranging for care during and after physical or mental illness</p>

4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE <sup>(3)</sup>
<p>Particularly hospitals, other establishments under medical or nursing management or supervision that specialise in the prevention, diagnosis or treatment of diseases or in follow-up care, care of disabled persons, nursing of persons needing care or in collecting blood or blood components or that offer other health and social services; medical practitioners; institutions or authorities offering home nursing and as a self-employed person.</p> <p><b>Pursuit of regulated professions on a self-employed basis:</b></p> <p>Upon notification of the district administrative authority according to Art. 36 of the Gesundheits- und Krankenpflegegesetz (GuKG; Health Care and Nursing Act), nurses with a Diploma in Paediatric Nursing are entitled to work on a self-employed basis.</p>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Specialised basic training at an educational institution for paediatric nurses under the Gesundheits- und Krankenpflegeausbildungsverordnung (Ordinance on Training in Health Care and Nursing)</li> <li>- Specialised course in paediatric nursing (Sonderausbildung) after completion of training in general nursing or specialised basic training in psychiatric nursing under the Gesundheits- und Krankenpflege-Spezialaufgaben-Verordnung (Ordinance on Special Duties in Health Care and Nursing)</li> <li>- short training course for auxiliary nurses and midwives at an educational institution for paediatric nurses under the Gesundheits- und Krankenpflege-Ausbildungsverordnung (Ordinance on Training in Health Care and Nursing)</li> </ul>
<b>Additional information:</b> <b>Entry requirements:</b> Specialised basic training (Spezielle Grundausbildung): Physical and mental fitness; trustworthiness; successful completion of ten school grades; admission test or interview. A board decides on admission. Specialised course (Sonderausbildung): Vocational competence in general nursing or psychiatric nursing; admission test or interview.
