3. Profile of skills and competences

Co-operation in all measures taken to detect, prevent and combat nosocomial infections and to maintain health.

This includes, in particular:

- Identification of the hygiene status in nursing, diagnostic, therapeutic and supply-related areas
- Co-operation in drawing up hygiene plans, hygiene standards and hygiene guidelines
- Co-operation in the procurement of disinfectants as well as in the procurement and preparation of products as far as these may give rise to infection risks
- Provision of advice to staff in all matters that are important for maintaining hygiene
- Co-operation in planning new buildings, annexes and modifications to existing buildings

4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE (3)

Particularly, hospitals and institutions that specialise in the prevention, diagnosis or treatment of diseases or in followup care, care of disabled persons or nursing of persons needing care or establishments that offer other health and social services.

Pursuit of regulated professions on a self-employed basis:

Upon notification of the district administrative authority according to Art. 36 of the *Gesundheits- und Krankenpflegegesetz (GuKG*; Health Care and Nursing Act), nurses are entitled to work on a self-employed basis.

Specialised training on anaesthetic nursing after completion of a training for nurses under the *Gesundheits- und Krankenpflege-Spezialaufgaben-Verordnung* (Ordinance on Special Tasks in Health Care and Nursing)

Additional information:

Entry requirements: Diploma in nursing; admission test or interview.

In agreement with the management of the specialised course, the institution organising it decides on admission.

Duration of education: 1,000 hours (7 months)

Theoretical instruction: 350 hours

<u>Subjects</u>: Epidemiology, microbiology and immunology; organisational and technical measures in the field of nursing to prevent and combat nosocomial infections; organisation and operational management; communication, applied pedagogy, conducting interviews and conflict resolution; project and quality management in hospital hygiene; legal bases of hospital hygiene

<u>Practical training</u>: 450 hours at specialised departments or other organisational units of a hospital and at a clinical-microbiological laboratory

Education objectives:

Acquisition of knowledge and skills for taking over and performing all activities required for fulfilling the relevant specialised tasks.
